One band that I seriously had the misfortune of overlooking in recent years was Frankenstein 3000. How did I not take a look at this group? They are awesome! I also didn't even realize this was my buddy Keith Roth's band. Many of you might recognize Keith from his radio show on 95.9 The Rat or on Sirius/XM's Hair Nation or the Boneyard. I know Keith from his days with his old band Bad Biscuit, who used to be at the top of the food chain on this music scene. They were one of my favorite local bands back then, and Keith was playing bass with them.

Anyway, when Bad Biscuit decided to call it quits, Keith switched from bass to guitar and put Frankenstein 3000 together as an outlet for the songs that Bad Biscuit never used. He recruited drummer Clint Gascoyne, bassist Eric Hoagland and his former Bad Biscuit lead guitarist Tommy Tafaro for the new project. His goal was simple: to wake the rock community up with his version of straight-up hard and heavy rock 'n' roll. Frankenstein 3000's first CD in 2005 was actually a cover record called *America's Hit Remakers*, which boasted guest vocalists like David Johansen from the New York Dolls, Cherie

Currie from The Runaways and the legendary Leif Garrett. In 2007, Frankenstein 3000 would finally put out a CD of their own songs called *Welcome To Planet Omega*. They liked putting out their own CDs so much that in 2009, they would release *Where Do We Go From Here*, and in 2010, another CD of covers called *They'll Be Waking Up Soon*.

In early 2012, Frankenstein 3000

released Allerton Avenue, which the band claims to be the best thing they've ever done, but hot on the heels of that album, the group released Escape From Planet Omega!, a collection of recordings from various sessions and lineups. It's kind of what they intended their debut album to be before it turned out to be a cover CD. Frankenstein 3000 are finally happy with the Omega project, more than seven years in the making. You have to check these guys out if you just love raw rock and roll! Log onto Frankenstein3000.com to hear songs like "Revolution (Coming Of Age)," "Panic In Needle Park" and "Everybody Else." Trust me when I tell you that it's hard not to like this band! You can catch them live this Saturday night (2/1) at The Stone Pony in Asbury Park as part of the Lords Of Mercy CD release party.
